This meeting is organised by MotorSport Vision Racing, governed by the General Competition Rules of Motorsport UK, incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA, additional Supplementary Regulations and any written instructions the organisers issue for the event.

3. COMPETITORS CIRCUIT/PADDOCK ACCESS & ALLOCATION

It is important that you follow instructions regarding parking within the paddock areas. Please liaise with the Paddock Manager before setting up.

Please find the access times below, if you testing, then please follow their instructions:

The paddock must be vacated by 21:00 on Saturday 09 April 2022.

4. SIGNING ON FOR COMPETITORS

All competitors will sign on using the below link. The only method to sign-on will be through this link and it must be done **no later than 24 hours before** your first session on track. This is to ensure that you aren't prevented from joining your relevant session:

When signing on all drivers must be in possession of, as required: a) Drivers and Entrants Motorsport UK Competition Licence. b) Drivers Medical Certificate (if not incorporated in the Licence). c) Valid Club Membership (where applicable). You may be asked to produce your licence at any time during an event, so please ensure you have it at the venue.

Any competitor holding a competition licence not issued by Motorsport UK MUST specify this on the entry form for the event. Further they can only participate with authorisation from their ASN (as required by the FIA International Sporting Code) and MUST present this written authorisation when signing on.

6. NOTICE BOARD

The official notice board will be located on the dedicated event page, on the MSVR website: www.msvracing.com/cars/calendar/

7. TIMING SCREEN

The Official Timing Screen will be the Starters timing screen in the Pit Lane.

8. SCRUTINEERING

Please ensure that you have completed, in its entirety, the Motorsport UK self-declaration scrutineering form.

At least 25% of vehicles will be physically inspected by a Motorsport UK scrutineer. These cars will be selected at random.

Visual scrutineering will be conducted on all competing vehicles just before noise testing at the entrance of the assembly area, and in the paddock road while waiting to avoid causing congestion. Scrutineers will have the power to perform random spot-checks on both cars and drivers' equipment throughout the event.

If you are unsure of your vehicle's ability to meet the required safety criteria set out in the Motorsport UK general regulations, then please find a Scrutineer and ask them to check this for you. Allow plenty of time before your first session on track

9. ELIGIBILITY

Eligibility may be checked by a member of the Motorsport UK Technical Commission listed in the 2022 Motorsport UK Yearbook at Appendix 5d. These Technical Commissioners will be considered as Judges of Fact within the Regulations. The Championship/Series licensed Eligibility Scrutineers are also considered Judges of Fact and empowered to undertake any measurements or examinations of vehicles.

10. DRIVERS RACING FOR THE FIRST TIME AT DONINGTON PARK

Competitors must read an instruction sheet that can be sent out upon request.

11. DRIVERS BRIEFINGS

All competitors are required to attend a briefing at the times and locations shown on the event timetable, before they go on track.

The briefing may be supplemented by written notes which will include any specific information for your series/championship and will be treated as an official event document.

The organisers reserve the right to call extra briefings as appropriate. Attendance/completion of the drivers briefing is mandatory.

12. ENGINE/NOISE POLLUTION

Engines must not be run before 0900 hours or after 2000 hours.

13. PIT LANE

Please note that there is a mandatory speed limit in the Pit Lane of 60 km/h.

The Pit Lane entry is on the LEFT after Roberts.

Competitors must not exit the pit lane when the red light at the pit exit is illuminated, or cross the blend line when joining the track.

14. COURSE FAMILIARISATION

Drivers are permitted to walk the course on Friday evening, 08th April from 18:00 or on Saturday 09th April from 07:30 to 08:30. When walking the course competitors MUST wear a 'dayglo' vest and MUST have signed on for the event. Competitors may also use pedal cycles subject to the same conditions.

15. CIRCUIT PROCEDURE

15.1 There will be one practice run and four timed runs in accordance with the timetable.

15.2 All competitors will be required in the Assembly Area 20 minutes prior to their practice/timed runs for noise testing. On instruction from marshals, cars will proceed from the Assembly Area directly into the pit lane.

15.3 Please make yourself familiar with the location of the Assembly Area before your first practice session.

15.4 A vehicle which leaves the track, involuntarily or otherwise, or becomes stationary on the track, may not complete its timed run. A vehicle which becomes stationary off the track may not return to the track until the driver is instructed to do so by a marshal. In all these instances a re-run will not be permitted.

15.5 IT IS A CONDITION OF THE EVENT THAT VEHICLES DO NOT OVERTAKE. In the case of a competitor being baulked by a slower car, he should maintain station and request the Clerk of the Course to grant a re-run. Bearing in mind the size of the entry, including reserves, this may not be granted.

16. START

16.1 The practising of competing cars outside the designated course area is strictly forbidden and may result in the competitor being excluded from the meeting forthwith.

16.2 There are no designated practice starts or tyre warming areas at this venue.

16.3 The start will be given by the lowering of the Union Flag.

16.4 When each vehicle is in position to start, the driver will be directed to watch the Starters Flag.

16.5 When the flag is lowered, the driver has a maximum of 5 seconds to leave the start-line. After this 5 second interval, the run will be void and no re-run will be given. If the competing vehicle has not left the start line within five seconds, the start marshal will display a red flag to the competitor and the run will be void. No re-runs will be awarded for this occurrence. Any driver who ignores the red flag and commences the run may be excluded from the event.

16.6 Automatic timing will commence when the vertical timing strut is sensed by the timing beam.

16.7 Circuit length: 2430 metres approximately.

17. END OF CIRCUIT PROCEDURE

The finish line is parallel to the start of the Exhibition Centre on the Exhibition Straight.

A chequered flag will be shown to cars crossing the finish line.

At the end of each run cars must slow down after taking the Chequered Flag and return to the pit lane for the next run. You must approach this area at slow speed as marshals will be on track to organise the next run.

At the end of the final timed run all cars must slow down after taking the Chequered Flag and leave the circuit by entering the pit lane and continue to Parc Fermé at the far end.

Cars being shared by two drivers should be driven to a safe position before rejoining the back of the queue at the startline for the numbers to be changed and for the second driver to take over.

All competitors will remain under Parc Fermé conditions until advised by the Scrutineers.

18. FLAGS/LIGHTS

If a RED FLAG/RED LIGHT is shown competitors must SIGNIFICANTLY reduce speed, being prepared to stop if required, and proceed around the course entering the pit lane.

19. RESULTS

All timesheets are deemed provisional until all vehicles are released by Scrutineers after Post Practice/Race Scrutineering and/or after completion of any Judicial or Technical Procedures.

Results of Qualifying and Races can be found on the virtual notice board on the MSVR website (www.msvracing.com/cars) where they will be available once any outstanding judicial matters have been resolved.

20. JUDGES OF FACT

Judges may be appointed in accordance with Motorsport UK Q3.1.

Timekeepers: To declare the individual lap times and the order in which the cars cross the timing line throughout the competition.

Scrutineers: In addition to the Championship/Series Eligibility Scrutineers, eligibility may be checked by a member of the Motorsport UK Technical Commission, as listed in the Motorsport UK Officials' Yearbook Appendix 5(d).

21. TIMING

Automatic timing will commence when the vertical timing strut is sensed by the timing beam.

22. PENALTIES

In the event of a competing car failing to keep all four wheels on the designated course a penalty of '4 wheels off' [4WO] will be imposed and no time will be given for that run.

23. SPECIAL CIRCUIT NOTICES
